Reason for Report: The purpose of this report is to

 Consider the submissions received during the section 62 consultation for the Woollahra Principal Local Environmental Plan – with regards to the opportunity sites at:

o Site 1A: Vaucluse Village: 1-7 Hopetoun Avenue, 22A -24 New South Head Road, 1 Petrarch Avenue, Vaucluse

Site 1B: Vaucluse Village: 77 New South Head Road, Vaucluse (car wash site)

 Obtain Council's approval to include the proposed planning changes identified for these opportunity sites in the preparation of the Draft Woollahra Principal Local Environmental Plan.

Recommendation

- A. That the proposed planning changes, for *Opportunity Site 1a: Vaucluse Village: 1-7 Hopetoun Avenue, 22A -24 New South Head Road, 1 Petrarch Avenue, Vaucluse*, be included with amendments in the Draft Woollahra Principal Local Environmental Plan.
- B. That the proposed planning changes, for *Opportunity Site 1b: Vaucluse Village: 77 New South Head Road, Vaucluse*, be included in the Draft Woollahra Principal Local Environmental Plan.
- C. That all persons notified during the Section 62 Consultation stage be notified during the Section 66 Consultation stage and informed of the changes arising from the Section 62 Consultation, irrespective of whether they made a submission or not.
- D. That a further report be presented to the Urban Planning Committee on the inclusion of the Edgecliff Centre site (203-233 and 235-285 New South Head Road, Edgecliff) as an opportunity site.
- E. That a further be presented to the Urban Planning Committee on the impacts of definition changes to gross floor area and floor space ratio in terms of dwelling yields.
- F. That a further report be presented to the Urban Planning Committee on the options for mandating additional dwellings when additional floor space and height is allowed.

accordance with Council's Code of Meeting Practice.

Recommendation:

That the responses to previous Questions for Next Meeting be noted.

Background:

The provision for Councillors to ask Questions for Next Meeting is contained in Section 3.2 of Council's Code of Meeting Practice which states:

3.2 QUESTIONS FOR NEXT MEETING - No previous notice of questions required

- 1) As a standard practice, "Questions for Next Meeting" shall be listed in all agendas of Ordinary Meetings of Council. The agenda item shall contain a report of the questions asked at the last Council Meeting and the responses to those questions and provide an opportunity for the Councillors to ask questions for the next Council Meeting.
- (2) Questions asked at a Council Meeting shall also be submitted in writing.
- (3) The Councillor must put every question directly, succinctly and without_argument.
- (4) The Mayor shall refer the question to the General Manager or responsible Division Head, or if the question is directed to another Councillor, the Councillor concerned. There shall be no requirement to answer the question immediately.
- (5) If the answer to a question can be given immediately, and it makes sense to do so,_then such shall be done and a record made in the Minutes of the Meeting. If an answer can be given, but not immediately, then the Mayor shall indicate to whom the question is to be directed.
- (6) In the spirit of achieving the expeditious discharge of Council business the agenda item "Questions for Next Meeting" shall generally be limited to not more than 30 minutes duration unless the Council determines otherwise, on the evening in question and by way of specific resolution.

Questions for Next Meeting should be asked in accordance with the Code of Meeting Practice.

Responses to Councillors Questions for Next Meeting on 11 April 2011 are as follows:

Councillor Shoebridge asking:

What notice has Council been given of the Sydney Harbour Park Draft Plan of Management on which submissions close on the 30 April 2011? Will Council be making a submission and what can Council do to inform the community of this consultation, including the proposals of a new ferry wharf at the city-side of Nielson Park? I am also told that the only public notice is a very small public notice stuck on the entrance way somewhere in Neilson Park advising on the public consultation.

Councillor Shoebridge further asking:

Can we make a submission and could staff also advise Councillors of the status of the Sydney Harbour Park Draft Plan of Management particular as is related to Neilson Park?

Manager Open Space & Trees in further response:

A submission to National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) on the Sydney Harbour National Park is currently being prepared by the Open Space and Trees staff.

A copy of the submission will be sent to Councillors.

Councillor Jarnason asking:

Could Council prepare a brief report to consider implementing safety measures or traffic slowing measures, to slow traffic on the bend of Edgecliff Road and Wellington Street. Cars tend to speed excessively around the bend and then brake rapidly before the pedestrian crossing which services a large number of school children and residents. Could staff have a look at that area and bring something back to the next Woollahra Local Traffic Committee.

Traffic Engineer in response:

This will be investigated and reported to Woollahra Local Traffic Committee.
