

Conditions of Entry



2019 Woollahra Environmental School Sculpture Prize

- Entrants must be enrolled in a primary or secondary school within the Woollahra Council Local Government Area (contact Council if you are unsure of your school's location).
- Each entry must be an original work that addresses the theme of Pollinators (see Council website for ideas). Only one entry per student is to be submitted. Student groups are able to work together to submit a Group entry.
- Entries must be made of recycled or reused materials. A good resource is Reverse Garbage, www.reversegarbage.org.au.
- Entrants should include an A4 photo diary with their entry (min 3 photos, max 10 photos) that shows them in the process of completing their work.
- Sculptures must be three dimensional (3D), no larger than 80cm in size in any axis, and no heavier than 3kg.
- Each sculpture must be freestanding (stable without any support).
- Entrants should complete and submit an online entry form prior to delivering their sculpture to Council. One online form should be completed per sculpture.
- Where a sculpture is being submitted by a group (more than one student), a list of all contributing students should be included in the online entry form.
- Sculptures and supporting photo diaries must be clearly labelled with the unique ID number received on submission of your online entry form and **hand-delivered** to Council Chambers no later than **4:30pm Monday 21 October 2019** as follows:

Further Information

- Where the number of entries exceeds capacity, finalists will be short listed by Council staff on the basis of originality, creativity and adherence to the competition theme and conditions. All displayed entrants will be notified in the week before the exhibition begins.
- Entrants should plan to attend the exhibition opening and announcement of winners on **Monday 28 October from 4:30pm**.
- Five prizes will be awarded - *Winner Junior Division* (grades K-2), *Winner Middle Division* (grades 3-6), *Winner Senior Division* (grades 7-12), *Best Group Entry* (grades K-12) and the *Viewer's Choice*. The Junior, Middle, Senior and Group category winners will be chosen by the judges appointed by Council. The Viewer's Choice will be awarded to the entrant whose entry receives the most votes from visitors throughout the two-week exhibition.
- Entrant work will be displayed at Council Chambers from 28 October to 8 November 2019 (M-F, 8am – 4:30pm).
- Prizes include passes to museums, gift vouchers, books and art and drawing equipment.
