The Community and Cultural Grants program offers the following:

- Small grants of up to \$2,000, available to non-profit community based organisations, groups or individuals, and
- Large grants of between \$2,000 and \$7,500, available to non-profit community based organisations or groups.

- Support vulnerable members of our community;

- Is there a demonstrated need for your project in the local Woollahra Area?
- What are the desired outcomes of your project?
- Do you or your organisation have the relevant experience to deliver these outcomes?
- Who in our community will benefit most from your project and how will you reach these community members?
- Do you have existing or developing partnerships with community groups or organisations in Woollahra?
- Is your budget well thought out and have you checked the expense items the grant will fund are not capital works items or wages for permanent staff members?
