<b>Glenmore Road Public School P &amp; C</b>	School Uniform Textile Rescue Programme	This project will introduce Worn Up, a textile rescue programme to our school. This project will save over 100kgs of textile waste going to landfill each year and will embed a reuse mindset in our children.	\$1,500
<b>Sydney Game Fishing Club</b>	Solar Power Project	As part of the 3-Council Solar My Club program, this grant funding will contribute to the installation of a 16kW solar PV power system on the roof of the club house.	\$2,000
<b>Goodstart Early Learning Double Bay</b>	Goodstart Kitchen Garden	This project installs water efficient wicking beds. We will then plant fresh produce, herbs and bush tucker plants that children will grow to utilize in sensory and cooking experiences.	\$2,000
<b>Voice for Power East (Jewsi)</b>	Jewish Community Transition to Clean Energy Project	Our volunteers will organise and host a series of educational and inspirational events at community venues and private homes, to encourage and facilitate uptake of rooftop solar, green power and energy efficiency/waste reduction.	\$1,500
<b>Splash without the Trash</b>	Rose Bay Kayak, Paddleboard and Beach Clean-up	The group will run monthly harbour and beach cleans to remove litter from Rose Bay, the harbour waters and our surrounding beaches.	\$2,000
<b>Vaucluse Public School</b>	Sustainer Containers	Reducing canteen waste by purchasing reusable lunchboxes that are the perfect size for lunch orders. This project helps to educate about reducing single use plastics.	\$1,953
<b>Double Bay Public School P &amp; C</b>	Bees and Bush Regeneration Garden	The project will introduce native species that thrive in the area and require less water, particularly the Eastern Suburbs Banksia Scrub species. Native Bees will complement our project and increase pollination.	\$1,550
