What's in it for you?

Local Residents

Becoming a volunteer member of Woollahra Council's Bushcare program will give you an exciting and rewarding opportunity to experience your local bushland first hand and learn about bush regeneration. You will meet like-minded individuals from your community and make new friends.

Businesses and Community Groups

Participating in a Bushcare program as a group encourages and enhances teamwork in a fun and supportive environment. Local businesses can participate in Bushcare programs and demonstrate support for environmental conservation.

School Groups and Tertiary Students

As a student, Bushcare can help you with practical environmental skills and experience in your field of study.

All volunteers receive:

- Bushcare training, including the *Bushcare Manual*
- on site supervision
- all necessary resources, including tools and equipment
- morning and/or afternoon tea
- the Bushcare newsletter and annual reviews.



What will Bushcare training teach you?

- The value of urban bushland
- Threats to urban bushland ecosystems
- Plant identification
- Weed identification and removal techniques
- Workplace Health & Safety awareness
- Revegetation and ecological restoration techniques
- Bushland site analysis.

Second Saturday and third Saturday of the month, 10am–2pm. Meet at the end of Edward St, Woollahra.

Gap Park

Every Wednesday, 9am–12pm. Meet behind the Gunyah Hall, Watsons Bay.

Lighthouse Reserve

Every Wednesday, 1pm–3pm. Meet at Lighthouse Reserve opposite Cambridge Avenue and Old South Head Road, Vaucluse.

Parsley Bay Reserve

Every Thursday, 9am–12pm. Meet at the Kiosk at the end of Horler Avenue, Vaucluse.

Christison Park

Every Thursday, 1pm–3pm. Meet at Southeast Corner of Christison Park on coastal cliff path, Vaucluse.

Trumper Park (Harris St)

Every Friday, 9am-12pm and the first Saturday of the month, 10am-2pm. Meet at the Trumper Park Pond, Paddington.

Trumper Park (New Mclean St)

Last Wednesday of month, 9am-12pm.
