


Explore Holdsworth's new events program




Visit Woollahra Gallery at Redleaf this summer

The Australian Government's Cheaper Home Batteries Program is offering a discount of around 30% on the upfront cost of installing eligible small-scale battery systems connected to new or existing solar systems. The NSW Government also has an incentive for connecting your solar battery to a Virtual Power Plant (VPP).


There are five key ways you can Go Electric in your home or business:

Doing a holiday clean up?

Before you bin an item, check it doesn't contain a battery

Products with in-built batteries, known as 'embedded batteries' are increasingly common household items.

Products containing batteries should never go in your yellow or red bins as they can start fires in our waste trucks. They also contain valuable resources which can be recycled (but not through your yellow bin!).

Common items containing embedded batteries include:

- Personal care items electric toothbrushes, shavers
- Toys light up toys, remote controlled and ride-on items
- Powerpacks and portable charging devices

- Mobile devices phones, laptops, Bluetooth speakers and headphones
- Wearable devices smart watches, trackers and medical aids
- Vapes
- Vacuum cleaners.

How to dispose of items containing batteries

If it's easy to remove the batteries, do so and then dispose of the rest of the item.

To dispose of your batteries, and items where the battery cannot be easily removed (laptops, mobiles, toothbrushes) book a pick-up through our free recycling service and we'll collect the item from your kerb the next business day.
