Woollahra Environmental Targets Summary Table 2012:2013

In 2010 the NSW government introduced Integrated Planning and Reporting Legislation. As part of this process Council has reviewed its 'State of the Environment' reporting process to more effectively track sustainability and environmental progress. Council has developed specific targets across five sectors; Energy, Water, Biodiversity, Transport and Waste.

Woollahra Municipal Council's Environmental Sustainability Action Plan (ESAP) was completed in June 2013, and details our targets and actions in each area.

This report outlines progress against our ESAP targets.
